I'm writing to you regarding the keyboard support fixture that I received from you two months ago. What a difference one simple change and a couple of months can make!

As I told you in our previous correspondence, I was in motorcycle accident two years ago, an accident that has left me with extensive paralysis on my right side, leaving me unable to use my dominant arm at all. I've seen several occupational therapists with the hope of training my left hand well enough to use my computer for vocational education and hopefully a career in the future. After many attempts at mastering both voice recognition software and manual- left-handed penmanship all the therapists agreed that my best chance for composition was to type to the computer. The problem came in while I spent long periods of time craning my neck and shoulders over a normally positioned keyboard, this position lead to unendurable pain for me do to neck and shoulder nerve damage sustained in my accident. I was getting nowhere with my rehabilitation and had really begun to feel trapped due to my inability to write even a simple letter or take course notes. .

My therapist suggested I raise my keyboard and my computer screen and found your fixture on the Internet for me. I honestly believe that I have never made a better investment of so little money. I can work comfortably at my computer for hours now as the strain on my shoulders and neck due to poor posture has been completely eliminated, my typing speed has increased to nearly the same rate as I had with two hands.

Roy, I can't thank you enough, your keyboard support fixture has changed everything about my approach to using a computer and has been the single, most positive move I have made in the rehabilitation of my writing skills. Though mine may be an extreme case due to my injuries I believe anyone who works at a computer would benefit by using your fixture and will end up feeling the same way I do. Who needs the strain and the pain? Why suffer through when you can buy one of these? It is not a bad looking piece of furniture either. You do nice work.
